Matriculation Next Steps

- Please create your MIT account as soon as possible; you will need an account for a number of next steps. If you have not already, you will be receiving an automated email from MIT prompting you to create an account, which will include relevant links and instructions. 48 72 hours after you create your account, you will be able to access all of the MIT spaces requiring an account, including the housing application and, for those of you that are international students, all next steps related to securing a student visa.
- **Install MIT Certificates**: <u>MIT certificates</u>. Certificates, along with your MIT Kerberos account, allow you access to MIT community member webpages, like the Housing application.
- New Admits: If you have not already done so, please send an official transcript (e-transcript or hard copy) directly from your previous university/universities to: mit-whoi-www@mit.edu (if e-transcript) or regular mail (if hard-copy) to: MIT-WHOI Joint Program, Attn: Patricia Nesti, 77 Massachusetts Ave, 54-812, Cambridge, MA 02139
- Atlas for New Graduate Students is your main Dashboard for most things at MIT, and has been updated for the 2023-2024 academic year.
 - Students must download the latest version of the Atlas application on their mobile or desktop to access the "Onboarding" tile, which will be available the week of April 17.
 - Students will only be able to access Atlas after they have created their Kerberos
 ID and installed <u>MIT certificates</u> on their computer, phone, or other device, and
 may find the latest version of MIT Atlas by visiting <u>apps.mit.edu</u> from any device
 including desktop computer; mobile devices may also search "MIT Atlas" in their

- preferred app store. Any students who go to the former Atlas dashboard site will see directions to the MIT Atlas app.
- Once downloaded, students can obtain important onboarding information and complete essential tasks, including: updating personal and medical information, completing forms such as the IPIA and I-9, required trainings, commuting and housing information, MIT ID Card creation, and information for international students.
- The MIT Office of Graduate Education (OGE) has a page for newly admitted students:

- If you're interested in MIT on-campus housing be sure to act soon; the portal opens in May. - International Students: please note that you must complete and submit the Financial Certification Form on iMIT in order for MIT to begin processing the I-20 documents. Once the I-20 is finalized (~3 weeks), it will be sent to you via hard copy mail. Be sure your mailing address is the most up-to-date in order to receive this document in a timely manner.
